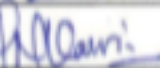

Report on NCC Cadets' Awareness Campaign for SOPs During Matriculation Exams

Date: 31st July 2024

Subject: Report on NCC Cadets' Efforts in Promoting SOP Awareness Among Students and Local Community During Matriculation Exams (19th - 22nd July 2022)

1. Introduction

In response to the COVID-19 pandemic, our college's NCC (National Cadet Corps) unit undertook a significant role in ensuring compliance with Standard Operating Procedures (SOPs) during the matriculation exams held from 19th to 22nd July 2022. This report highlights the activities conducted by the NCC cadets aimed at raising awareness of SOPs among exam appearing students and the local community of Bhatkal.

2. Objectives

- To raise awareness about COVID-19 SOPs among students appearing for matriculation exams.
- To engage with the local community to reinforce public health measures.

3. NCC Cadets' Activities

a. Awareness Campaigns (Pre-Exam Period)

- **Information Booths:** NCC cadets set up information booths near examination halls where students could ask questions and get clarifications about SOPs.
- **Local Community Engagement:**
 - **Public Announcements:** Through loudspeakers and community radio, cadets made regular announcements about COVID-19 safety measures, reminding local residents to follow health guidelines to protect themselves and others.
 - **Visibility Patrols:** Cadets patrolled local areas around the examination center, engaging with community members and reinforcing the importance of SOPs. They addressed concerns and provided information about safe practices.

c. Post-Exam Activities

- **Feedback Collection:** Cadets collected feedback from students and community members regarding the effectiveness of the awareness campaigns and SOP enforcement. This feedback was used to assess the impact and identify areas for improvement.

4. Outcomes and Impact

5. Challenges

- **Information Overload:** Some individuals found the volume of information overwhelming. To address this, cadets refined their messaging to be more concise and focused.
- **Resource Constraints:** Limited resources posed challenges in reaching every individual effectively. Enhanced collaboration with local organisations could improve coverage in future campaigns.

6. Recommendations

- **Enhanced Training:** Provide more comprehensive training for cadets on public communication and health advocacy to improve effectiveness in future campaigns.
- **Collaboration:** Partner with local health authorities and organisations to strengthen community outreach and resource allocation.
- **Ongoing Engagement:** Implement continuous awareness programs even after the immediate examination period to maintain high levels of public health adherence.

7. Conclusion

The involvement of NCC cadets in promoting SOP awareness during the matriculation exams was highly effective. Their dedication to educating students and the local community significantly contributed to maintaining a safe examination environment and reinforcing public health measures.
